- **Delhi to run 11 hospitals under PPP model, adding >10,000 beds**

The Delhi government announced plans to operate 11 government hospitals using a public-private partnership approach, aiming to expand bed capacity and accelerate completion of delayed hospital projects — a major boost to the capital's healthcare infrastructure.

- **“World of Humanity” disability hospital nearing completion**

Public Health & Environment

- **Pollution crisis prompts health protections in Delhi-NCR**

The Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) banned outdoor sports activities amid dangerous pollution levels, warning of serious health risks — especially for children — as poor air quality persists.

Research & Clinical Evidence

- **AIIMS study finds no link between COVID-19 vaccination and sudden deaths**

A year-long autopsy-based study from AIIMS, Delhi, reconfirms that COVID-19 vaccines are *not associated* with sudden death in young adults, and highlights coronary artery disease as a leading cause of unexplained sudden deaths.

- **Heart disease rising as a major killer in younger adults**

Separate medical reporting highlights that heart disease is now a leading cause of sudden deaths under age 45 in India, underscoring the urgent need for early screening and preventive cardiology efforts.
