1. AMRIT Pharmacy Expansion

- Union Health Minister J.P. Nadda inaugurated 10 new AMRIT pharmacies across India as part of the 10th anniversary of the AMRIT programme.
- According to him, these pharmacies have served 6.85 crore
 patients so far, dispensing medicines worth ~₹17,000 crore (MRP)
 at significant discounts, leading to a cumulative saving of ~₹8,500
 crore for patients.
- He also outlined a vision to expand the AMRIT network to 500 outlets, targeting coverage in every medical college and district hospital.

2. MedTech Boost at AMTZ

- Piyush Goyal, Union Minister of Commerce & Industry, inaugurated a 3i MedTech facility at the Andhra Pradesh MedTech Zone (AMTZ) in Visakhapatnam.
- Alongside, a Cath-lab (catheterisation laboratory) manufacturing unit under Innovation Imaging Technologies Pvt Ltd (IITPL) was launched.
- The aim is to build more self-reliance in medical device manufacturing and produce affordable, advanced diagnostic-imaging equipment.
