# Ayushman Bharat: Hospital Participation & Claim Monitoring

The Union Health Ministry reviewed hospital participation and claim trends under **Ayushman Bharat**, emphasising reduction in delayed reimbursements, standardisation of treatment packages, and tighter fraud-control mechanisms.

### **Public Hospitals: Winter Readiness Review**

State health departments conducted **winter preparedness assessments** in major public hospitals, focusing on oxygen availability, emergency drugs, ventilator readiness, and staffing for night and weekend shifts.

## **NMC Updates on Medical College Compliance**

The **National Medical Commission** reiterated that **annual inspections and digital monitoring** would continue to ensure compliance with faculty, infrastructure, and clinical-load norms in medical colleges.

#### **Expansion of Critical Care Training**

Medical institutions increased focus on **short-term critical care and emergency medicine training programmes** for resident doctors and medical officers to manage seasonal surges in respiratory and cardiac emergencies.

#### **Digital Health: Interoperability Push**

Hospitals reported progress in integrating **electronic health records (EHRs)** with national digital health platforms, enabling smoother referrals, discharge summaries, and follow-up care across facilities.

## Al in Diagnostics: Wider Adoption

Al-based tools for **radiology prioritisation**, **ECG analysis**, **and pathology screening** saw wider use, particularly in high-volume government hospitals to reduce reporting backlogs.

# **Air Pollution & Winter Morbidity**

Public health experts noted continued rise in **pollution-related morbidity**, with increased outpatient visits for asthma, COPD, and ischemic heart disease. Preventive advisories were reiterated for elderly and high-risk patients.

## **Tuberculosis Programme: Field Activities Intensified**

Field-level activities under the **National TB Elimination Programme** focused on active case finding, treatment adherence, and follow-up of high-risk contacts during winter months.

#### **ILI & SARI Surveillance Continues**

Health authorities continued nationwide surveillance for **influenza-like illness** (ILI) and **severe acute respiratory infection (SARI)**, advising clinicians to maintain early testing and isolation protocols where indicated.
