



1. Healthcare Policy & Budget Discussions

- Ahead of the **Union Budget 2026–27**, health experts and industry bodies have called for **increased public health spending**, including GST relief on lifesaving equipment and vaccines, and a stronger focus on preventive care and innovation.
- Commentary suggests that India's health strategy needs to emphasize **prevention, innovation, and broader resource allocation** rather than predominantly hospital-based curative spending.

5. Nipah Virus Alert

There are emerging reports of a **Nipah virus outbreak near Kolkata**, prompting disease control authorities to heighten surveillance and coordinate response measures — a priority due to Nipah's high fatality rate and lack of vaccines.

6. Healthcare System Challenges & Trends

- **Mental health gap:** Experts warn India still faces a **wide treatment gap** — with up to 80–85 % of people with mental illnesses not receiving care, highlighting workforce and access needs.
- **Antimicrobial resistance (AMR):** Authorities have issued advisories requiring doctors to clearly document reasons for prescribing antibiotics to curb inappropriate use and the growing threat of drug-resistant infections.

7. Medical Education & Training

- Courts and policy discussions continue regarding **medical education standards and postgraduate seat optimization**, including legal judgments on entrance examination cutoffs and utilization of vacant seats.
- The Indian government has been expanding medical education capacity significantly — adding thousands of new MBBS and postgraduate seats to strengthen the doctor workforce nationwide.

8. Public Health Progress

- Recent TB reports show India achieved substantial reductions in tuberculosis incidence and deaths over recent years, although the country still carries a large share of the global TB burden.
