### 1. Cheaper Diabetes & Obesity Drugs Launched in India

- Indian pharmaceutical companies introduced **low-cost generic versions of semaglutide** (used in diabetes & obesity).
  - Prices are **~70% lower** than original brands like Ozempic/Wegovy.
  - This follows **patent expiry in India**, opening a major market opportunity.
  - Expected impact:
    - Improved **accessibility for diabetes patients**
    - Increased competition among Indian pharma companies

- Over **18,600 Jan Aushadhi Kendras** are now operational across India.
  - These centers provide:
